The four key things they try to do are: 1) serve churches in the US by giving them a place to send their used literature. 2) help Christians overseas mature in their faith by making such material available to them. 3) provide a supply line of Christian literature going into various countries and re-stocking their shelves with new material. 4) train nationals in their own country by supplying Bible schools and colleges with books and churches with needed supplies. Take to shut-ins and rehome residents.

Set up a booth at a flea market or state fair and give out the magazines for free.

Call crisis centers to see if they need adult or children's literature.

Take Missions Mosaic magazines, attach an invitation to your women's meeting to the front, and pass out to the women of the church.
